The Blaisdell Family National Association (BFNA) American History Scholarship will be awarded for the first time to a 2009 graduating high school student who will pursue an undergraduate degree with a concentrated study in American History, American Literature, American Government or Journalism. This award is intended to promote the study of our country's history among our finest students. The scholarship is an award of \$1,000.

The Blaisdell Family National Association Scholarship will be awarded to qualified applicants regardless of race, religion, sex or national origin.

All applicants must be sponsored by a current Basic Member of the Blaisdell Family National Association.

Only applications completed correctly and submitted in one package will be considered. Incorrect applications or applications mailed to an incorrect address will be discarded. No records are returned. Do not submit a personal photo. If your records feature a photo, it must be fully covered.

After the scholarship winner has been selected, a photo and brief bio will be requested for use in the Blaisdell Family National Association's *Blaisdell Papers*, which is published in June and December each year. All applicants will be notified of the results.

The award is placed on deposit with the tax-exempt accredited four-year U.S. college. Any unused portion shall be returned to the Blaisdell Family National Association. The award is based on academic merit, participation in school and community activities, commitment to the study of American History, American Literature, American Government or Journalism, and financial need. No affiliation with the Blaisdell Family National Association is necessary.

The Blaisdell Family National Association must receive applications by the February 15 deadline.
